

#### **Hitting Rock Bottom**

Desperation can lead people to behave in ugly and irresponsible ways, as the characters in *Hurlyburly* discover. They partake in heavy drug usage, alcohol consumption and empty personal relationships. And because they live in a world of paranoia, fear and self-loathing, they don't learn their lessons when they should.

But what is incumbent upon them is the fact that they must change at some point or they will not survive; their self-destructive choices will destroy them.

This play is important because these characters do survive their self-inflicted suffering when they realize they can. But David Rabe's characters need to sink to the lowest depths to reveal to all of us that our choices affect not only ourselves, but many people, including those who love us. Without sinking that low, they can't improve the quality of their lives or find peace of mind.

Despite selfish or hurtful conduct, anyone can alter their path and make a better life for themselves and for those people affected by them. This production exposes the hurt caused by narcissism ... but celebrates hope.
