Director's Notes

"I ask the help of the gods, who know the trick, change me, and let me glimpse the secret and speak..."

Metamorphosis means change. It has also been defined as "a transformation, as if by magic." When the great roman poet, Ovid (43 B.C.-A.D. 17), decided to retell various myths from Greek, Latin and Eastern sources, he used the connecting theme of change to tie his 15 "books" together. Mary Zimmerman, who directed and wrote *Metamorphoses* over several years (gestating at Northwestern University as early as 1996 and making it to Broadway in 2002), added the sensual connecting theme of water to the staging. While some of the stories (like that of King Midas, for example) have only a slight connection with the fluid element, others (like that of Alcyone and Ceyx) are deeply rooted in the waves. In all of these tales, one thing is certain: The gods are very much



a part of humankind's existence—for better or worse. And the gods themselves have the same challenges that humans face every day. They have the same needs, the same passions, the need for revenge, the need for love. The Therapist tells us during the tale of Phaeton, "It has been said that the myth is a public dream, dreams are private myths." She also tells us that it is important "to speak not only of the rational and easily understood, but also of enigmatic things: the irrational and the ambiguous. To speak both privately and publicly." Zimmerman found that public discourse (this play) was a wonderful way to connect with fellow human beings. It allows us the chance to understand the will of the gods as well as the ways of each other. Two thousand-year-old words can speak clearly to us today. Perhaps we can change, and understand the truly important things in life.

Composer and Musician Michael Croswell

Michael Croswell is a theatrical composer and musician who graduated from MSU in 1988 with a B.S. in Music Management.

Michael's first collaboration with MSU Theatre was a 1986 production of *Equus* for the Pit Theatre, predecessor to the Andreas Theatre, that was located in the basement of the Centennial Student Union. He also worked with Paul J. Hustoles in creating an original score for a 1988 production of *The Bacchae*, which was presented in the CSU's Ostrander Auditorium. He came back as an alumnus to work with

Hustoles once again as composer and performer for the Ted Paul Theatre production of *The Tempest* in 1990 and last season for *Equus*.

Since leaving Mankato, Michael has worked in a variety of professional theater settings around the United States. Credits include collaborations with The Madison Repertory Theater (A Streetcar Named Desire, Our Country's Good), San Diego Junior Theater, The Nebraska Shakespeare Festival (Julius Caesar, The Winter's Tale, Hamlet, The Tempest), Stages Theater (Jungle Book, The Velveteen Rabbit, Pinnochio, Snow White) and an Off-Broadway sound design at the Westside Theater in New York.

Since returning for Equus (2003), he has composed music for a production of Twelfth Night at the Nebraska Shakespeare Festival, composed and performed a set of live music for Metro States' "Strange Attractors" Concert series and performed in the pit orchestra for Frank Theater's The Cradle will Rock in Minneapolis. Most recently, he created the sound score for an original play, Jairus and the Wondershop, at Stages Theatre Co. in Hopkins. In 2003, he received a McKnight Composer Fellowship through the American Composers Forum.
