I, Don Quixote

In 1605, Miguel de Cervantes y Saavedra published *Don Quixote*, a rambling, epic length novel of the adventures of Alonso Quijana, a country squire convinced he is a knight errant in a time 300 years after the era of chivalry. Since its publication, the novel, considered to be one of the most translated books of all time, and the character of Don Quixote have inspired numerous ballets, symphonies, operas, plays, musicals, films and works of art, including the musical you see tonight, *Man of La Mancha*. Humanity's fascination with this mad knight who lives in a fantasy world and tilts at windmills, always fighting for those weaker than himself, pursuing goodness in a world of cynicism, is an enduring testimony to Cervantes' genius. Like the work of his contemporary, William Shakespeare, the tale transcends time and offers inspiration to each new generation.

In 1959, playwright Dale Wasserman was inspired by the idea of Don Quixote. His research turned to a fascination not only with the novel, but with its author, Cervantes. Not satisfied with his initial version, a television play *I*, Don Quixote, starring Lee J. Cobb (famous for his portrayal of Willy Loman, in Death of a Salesman), Wasserman found collaborators in director Albert Marre, composer Mitch Leigh and lyricist Joe Darion and together they translated Wasserman's ideas into the musical, Man of La Mancha. there were few producers interested in an unconventional musical with a serious plot, Spanish-inspired music and no toe-tapping numbers. With a budget that was one tenth of that of the traditional musical of the times, they managed to open the play off Broadway in 1965, and the rest is history. *Man of La Mancha* went on to Broadway and became one of the most successful and longest running musicals of the 1960s.

Wasserman says he found inspiration not only in the life of Cervantes, which provides the dramatic framework for the musical, but in a line of Quixote's in the novel: "I know who I am, and *who I may be if I choose.*" Quixote chooses to live a life dedicated to selflessness and constant striving for that which is beyond his grasp, to dream of a world in which all are treated with respect and the goodness of humanity is celebrated. He rejects the cynicism and evil of reality, creating a world of illusion in which the strong protect the weak, in which goodness triumphs over wickedness.

It has been 40 years since Man of La Mancha opened off Broadway and 400 years since Miguel de Cervantes first published Don Quixote. And we still, perhaps with a sense of sadness in our post 9/11 world, subject to man-made and natural disasters, ask the same question as Quixote does in the play, "When life itself seems lunatic, who knows where madness lies?" —Nina LeNoir
