Wisenberg will lead writing workshops at 9 a.m. Tuesday through Friday in Room 256 of Centennial Student Union. On Tuesday at 3 p.m. she will talk about the craft of writing, and on Thursday at 7:30 p.m. she will read from her work. Both talks will be in Ostrander Auditorium and are open to the public. Wisenberg also will be interviewed on "Authors in Transit," KMSU 89.7 FM, Friday at 11:05 a.m.

Wisenberg's stories, essays and articles have appeared in The New Yorker, Tikkun, Creative Nonfiction, the Chicago Reader and Chicago Tribune. Her essay collection, *Holocaust Girls: History, Memory & Other Obsessions*, was published in 2002 by the University of Nebraska Press. Her short story collection, *The Sweetheart Is In*, was released in April 2001 by TriQuarterly Books/ Northwestern University Press. She leads writing workshops in the Chicago area, and works individually with writers.
