I finished my other classes back in the Twin Cities, with Dr. Barrett and a Geography professor who came to work on a motorcycle (cannot recall his name). I completed a 1-year internship at the old State Welfare Dept in Saint Paul. I had my graduation ceremony in Mankato on the upper campus, June 1975. I went on to work in State, Regional, county, and city government (as well as indirectly with township boards and officials); and a brief time at a private land use consulting company - all over a 29-year period. Then I did other work, and retired in 2022.
