GOPHERS OPEN WCHA SEASON WITH MSU

The University of Minnesota opens the WCHA season with a home series against Minnesota State University, Mankato this weekend. Friday's game is scheduled for a 6:07 p.m. start, while Saturday's contest is a 3:07 p.m. tilt.

FOLLOWING THE GOLDEN GOPHERS

The Gophers will have an audio webcast available for both games this weekend. Audio and live stats will be available for all home games this season on www.gophersports.com.

ON THE DOCKET

The Gophers will hit the road for the next two weekends as they face No. 1 Wisconsin, Oct. 21-22 at the Kohl Center in Madison, Wis. Minnesota's next road test will be the following week as it travels to Columbus, Ohio, to face Ohio State, Oct. 27-28. The Maroon and Gold return home Nov. 3-4 and face Minnesota-Duluth.

THIS TIME LAST YEAR

After going 1-1 in the 2005 Easton Shootout, the Gophers opened the WCHA season with a two-game sweep over the Bemidji State Beavers in Bemidji, Minn. The Gophers won the first game, 2-0, while winning the second by a score of 3-2. Minnesota was ranked fourth in both polls.

MARVIN AND FORMER GOPHERS NAMED TO USA'S FOUR NATIONS CUP

USA Hockey has announced today that sophomore forward Gigi Marvin (Warroad, Minn.) and former Gophers Natalie Darwitz (Eagan, Minn.) and Krissy Wendell (Brooklyn Park, Minn.) have been named to the U.S. Four Nations Cup team roster. The trio will compete against Canada, Finland and Sweden, Nov. 7-11, in Kitchener, Ont. Darwitz, Marvin and Wendell are among 19 players listed on the roster, while three spots have yet to be determined. Team USA will hold a training camp at the Ann Arbor (Mich.) Ice Cube (home to USA Hockey's National Team Development Program) from Oct. 29 - Nov. 4 to determine the final three spots. The U.S. Women's Select Team's tournament-opening game will be against Canada on Tuesday, Nov. 7.

Marvin will miss the Gopher series against Niagara, Nov. 11-12 at Ridder Arena. The 2006 Western Collegiate Hockey Association's Rookie of the Year, Marvin posted 46 points in her freshman season a year ago. She was named to the

WCHA All-Rookie Team and was named to the All-WCHA Third Team. A member of USA's Under-22 Team this past August, Marvin has four points in two games played for Minnesota this season.

Darwitz and Wendell are each two-time Olympians, competing in the 2002 and 2006 Winter Games. Darwitz, who currently plays with the Minnesota Whitecaps, finished her career as the Gophers' all-time leading scorer with 246 points and was a three-time All-American. In her last season with the Gophers, Darwitz set an NCAA record with 114 points in just one season. Wendell, who now plays with the Etobicoke Dolphins in Toronto Ont., was Team USA's captain at the 2006 Winter Olympics. She finished her Gopher career as a two-time WCHA Player of the Year and the first WCHA player to earn the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award. The Kazamier is given to the best Division I women's hockey player in the country.

LEADING THE PACK

Erica McKenzie and Gigi Marvin have picked up where they left off a year ago, leading the Gopher scoring drive. McKenzie has netted two goals and two assists for four points, while Marvin has a goal and three assists.

In all, the Gophers have 11 players scoring a point in the opening weekend. Kelli Blankenship, Andrea Nichols, Whitney Graft and Melanie Gagnon have three, while Anya Miller, Jenelle Philipczyk and Becky Wacker have two points. Brittany Francis and Dagney Willey each got on the board with one point.

GOPHER RECORD AT HOME

In the past four years, the Gophers have recorded a home record of 55-11-2 and a winning percentage of 82 percent. In fact, since the program started, Minnesota holds a 124-21-10 mark on their home ice.

FRESHMEN FIRSTS

Freshmen forwards Kelli Blankenship and Brittany Francis each recorded their first career points in a Gopher jersey last weekend. Blankenship and Francis each tallied an assist in the 5-2 win over Maine, Oct. 6. Blankenship then followed with a two-goal performance against New Hampshire, scoring an even-strength and a power-play goal.

RACKING UP THE SHOTS

In Friday's game against Maine, the Gophers had 52 shots on goal, the most in the last two years. Against Ohio State a year ago, Minnesota had 47 in a 9-5 win. The 52, however, is well behind the school record of 73, set against Augsburg on Feb. 13, 1999.

SERIES RECORDS

Friday and Saturday marks the 35th and 36th meeting between the two teams with Minnesota posting a 31-1-2 mark against the Mavericks. In the past five games against the Mavericks, Minnesota and MSU have played in three overtime contests. After defeating MSU, 1-0 in Mankato, Minn., on Dec. 9, 2005, the two teams skated to a 1-1 tie on Dec. 10. In the home series, Minnesota battled back to win back-to-back overtime games against MSU. Ashley Albrecht scored the gamewinner on February 3, in a 2-1 victory. The following day, Andrea Nichols scored the game-winning goal, also in overtime, with a 4-3 final. Minnesota then faced the Mavericks in the first round of the WCHA Playoffs and won the series in two of three games.

SCOUTING THE MAVERICKS

The Mavericks opened the season with a 6-0 win over Robert Morris, but fell in a two-game series to Minnesota Duluth last weekend. UMD posted a 3-1 win last Friday and a 6-1 win last Saturday at All Seasons Arena in Mankato, Minn. Head coach Jeff Vizenor is in his sixth season as the head coach of the Mavericks. Junior Lindsay Macy is MSU's leading scorer with four points. Maggie Fisher, 2006 WCHA All-Rookie Team member, and Shera Vis are in second with three points. MSU returns Britni Kehler in net this year. Last year Kehler held a .925 percent save percentage and a 2.38 goals against average.

THE LAST TIME

Minnesota advanced to the WCHA Championships with a 6-0 win over Minnesota State as it won two games in the First Round of the WCHA Playoffs. In the second game of the series, the Gophers and Mavericks went scoreless in the first period. Minnesota, however, broke out of the intermission scoring three goals in the second period. The Gophers got on the board when Liz Palkie scored her first goal of the season at 2:39 of the second period on an unassisted play. Minnesota added its second goal of the period when Marley Wournell scored her second goal of the season at 14:02 of the period. The Gophers notched their third goal of the period at 18:34 when Gigi Marvin scored a power-play goal. Minnesota then lit the lamp three additional times in the third period. Anya Miller scored her third goal of the season on a slapshot attempt just inside the blue line at 5:17 of the second. Whitney Graft netted her seventh goal of the season at

10:25 of the third. Erica McKenzie tagged on the final blow when she scored at 14:00 of the third. In all, Minnesota had 12 skaters earn a point in the win.

ALL-USCHO TEAM

Bobbi Ross and Kim Hanlon have been selected to the U.S. College Hockey Online's Preseason All-USCHO Third Team. Ross, a team captain and last year's team most valuable player had 43 points in her sophomore campaign. In 40 games played, Ross scored 21 goals and had three hat tricks on the season. Hanlon was voted the team's most improved player after becoming the WCHA Goaltending Champion. Hanlon led the nation with a 1.19 goals against average in 19 games played.

GOPHERS RANKED SECOND IN WCHA PRESEASON POLL

The University of Minnesota is ranked second in the WCHA preseason poll, announced last week by the WCHA. Wisconsin holds the No. 1 spot, followed by the Gophers and Minnesota Duluth. It is the second-straight year the league has selected Wisconsin to win the conference title. St. Cloud and Minnesota State round out the top five.

GOPHERS IN THE POLLS

The University of Minnesota is ranked fifth in the USA Today/USAHM poll in the USCHO.com poll. In the next three weeks, Minnesota will face two top-three ranked teams in the nation. Minnesota travels to No. 1 Wisconsin, Oct. 21-22. The Gophers fell to No. 2 New Hampshire, 6-5 in overtime to hold a 0-1-0 record against ranked opponents this season.

EASTON SHOOTOUT RECAP

The Golden Gophers went 1-1 in the Easton Shootout last weekend, defeating Maine, 5-2, but fell to No. 2 New Hampshire, 6-5, in overtime. Against Maine, Minnesota opened its scoring drive with a power-play goal at 11:35 of the first. Gigi Marvin netted her first goal of her sophomore season, as Wacker and Anya Miller assisted on the play. Maine tied the game, 1-1, at 15:45 of the first. Erica McKenzie put the Gophers up, 2-1, when she notched a power-play goal of her own at 5:59 of the second period. The Maroon and Gold cushioned their lead when Andrea Nichols scored a goal at 13:51 of the second. Miller scored her first goal of the season on a slap-shot attempt at 13:38 of the third. Maine added its second goal of the game at 18:29 of the third period. Minnesota, however, added its final blow at 18:46 of the third by Jenelle Philipczyk.

Similiar to the NCAA semifinal game, Minnesota and UNH battled back and forth for the lead. Kelli Blankenship scored an early goal to put the Gophers up, 1-0. The Wildcats responded when they scored at 14:58 of the first. Blankenship, however, scored her second goal of the period at 16:12. The Gophers added to their lead when Andrea Nichols scored a short-handed

goal at 1:06 of the second period. The Wildcats, however, quickly scored two goals to put the game at a 3-3 tie. The Wildcats took their first lead when they scored at 14:47 of the second, holding the lead until the third period. Minnesota came back and tied the game at 4:01 of the third period when Whitney Graft scored a power-play goal for her first goal of the year. The Wildcats took the lead for the second time in the game, scoring at 12:43 of the third. The Gophers again tied the game when McKenzie rifled in a one-timer at 18:06 of the third to put the game into overtime. The Gophers were then called with a cross-checking penalty and UNH took advantage as Martine Garland shot a rocket passed Gopher goalie Brittony Chartier for the overtime victory at 2:33.

TEAM CAPTAINS

The Golden Gophers are fortunate to have senior Andrea Nichols and junior Bobbi Ross as captains for the 2006-07 season. Nichols served as last year's captain, while Ross served as an assistant captain.

FIVE STRAIGHT YEARS

The Gophers made their fifth straight NCAA Frozen Four appearance in the 2005-06 campaign. The Gophers' reign started in the 2002 when Minnesota tied for third overall in the nation. The Marcon and Gold made its second appearance at the 2003 Frozen Four in Duluth, Minn., finishing fourth. In 2004 the Marcon and Gold won their first championship with a 6-2 victory over Harvard, while following with another championship in 2004-05 with a 4-3 win again over the Crimson. Minnesota finished second overall after it defeated New Hampshire, 5-4, but fell to Wisconsin, 3-0 in the championship game.

WCHA DOMINANCE

Since the inception of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association started for women's hockey, the league has garnered seven national championships. Minnesota was the first team from the WCHA to win a national championship when it won the 1999-2000 AWCHA championship. Since then, Minnesota Duluth won three NCAA Frozen Four championships, followed by the Gophers in 2003-04 and 2004-05. Wisconsin won the championship last year, marking the seventh-straight time a WCHA member has won the national title.
